FROM WATCH SHOP TO CONCENTRATION CAMP

The inspirational true story of a devoted Christian family who felt they could not just watch the devastating circumstances of the Jews, so Corrie set out on an incredible rescue mission putting herself and her family at great risk. In this production we follow Corrie Ten Boom's journey from family watch shop to Ravensbruck concentration camp. The audience will encounter faith in action, hope and despair, and humiliation in the dark and brutal days of the second world war. Ultimately, this historical account challenges us, that the greatest prison is not one surrounded by barbed wire or walls but, is in fact within our own being.
